

IMPRISONMENT

Accordingly, the defendant, VIKRAM S BUDDHI, is hereby committed to the custody of the United States Bureau of Prisons to be imprisoned for a total term of fifty-seven months.

This total term of imprisonment consists of a term of fifty-seven months on each of count(s) 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10 and 11 all to be served concurrently with each other, .

The defendant is remanded to the custody of the United States Marshal.

SUPERVISED RELEASE

Immediately upon release from imprisonment, the defendant shall be placed on supervised release for a total term of three year(s). This total term consists of a term of three year(s) on each of count(s) 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10 and 11, all such terms to run concurrently. Also, if subject to deportation, the defendant shall be delivered to an authorized immigration official for deportation proceedings.

If the defendant is not deported, then, while on supervision, the defendant shall comply with the following mandatory, standard, and special conditions:

MANDATORY CONDITIONS

1. The defendant shall not commit another federal, state or local crime.
2. The defendant shall not unlawfully possess a controlled substance.
5. The defendant shall submit to and cooperate with the collection of a DNA sample by the probation officer as required by 42 U.S.C. §14135(a).

STANDARD CONDITIONS

1. The defendant shall not leave the judicial district or other specified geographic area without the permission of the court or probation officer.
2. The defendant shall report to the probation officer as directed by the court or probation officer and shall submit a truthful and complete written report within the first five days of each month.
3. The defendant shall answer truthfully all inquiries by the probation officer and follow the instructions of the probation officer.
4. The defendant shall support the defendant's dependents and meet other family responsibilities.
5. The defendant shall work regularly at a lawful occupation unless excused by the probation officer for schooling, training, or other acceptable reasons.
6. The defendant shall notify the probation officer at least ten days before any change of residence or employment.
7. The defendant shall refrain from excessive use of alcohol and shall not purchase, possess, use, distribute, or administer any controlled substance, or any paraphernalia related to any controlled substance, except as prescribed by a physician.

8. The defendant shall not frequent places where controlled substances are illegally sold, used, distributed, or administered, or other places specified by the court or probation officer.
9. The defendant shall not associate with any person engaged in criminal activity and shall not associate with any person convicted of a felony unless granted permission to do so by the probation officer.
10. The defendant shall permit a probation officer to visit the defendant at any time at home or elsewhere and shall permit confiscation of any contraband observed in plain view by the probation officer.
11. The defendant shall notify the probation officer within seventy-two hours of being arrested or questioned by a law enforcement officer.
12. The defendant shall not enter into any agreement to act as an informer or a special agent of a law enforcement agency without the permission of the court.
13. As directed by the probation officer, the defendant shall notify third parties of risks that may be occasioned by the defendant's criminal record or personal history or characteristics, and shall permit the probation officer to make such notifications and to confirm the defendant's compliance with such notification requirement.
14. The defendant shall pay the special assessment and any other financial obligations imposed by the court that have not been paid at the time of placement on supervision in accordance with the court-established payment schedule.
15. The defendant shall notify the probation officer of any material change in the defendant's economic circumstances that might affect the defendant's ability to pay any unpaid special assessment or court imposed financial obligation.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

1. If the defendant is deported or excluded from the United States, either voluntarily or involuntarily, the defendant shall not reenter the United States without legal permission and if reentry into the United States occurs, the defendant shall report to the nearest probation office within seventy-two hours of reentry.
2. Whether or not the defendant is deported or excluded from the United States, the defendant shall comply with the rules and regulations of the Bureau of Immigration and Customs Enforcement under the United States Department of Homeland Security.
4. The defendant shall not possess a firearm, ammunition, destructive device, or any other dangerous weapon.
12. The defendant shall submit the defendant's person, property, residence, office or vehicle to a search conducted by a probation officer, at a reasonable time and in a reasonable manner, whenever the probation officer has reasonable suspicion of contraband or of the violation

of a condition of supervision. Failure to submit to a search may be a ground for revocation and defendant shall warn any other residents that the premises the defendant is occupying may be subject to searches pursuant to this condition.

15. If not employed at a regular lawful occupation, the defendant shall perform at least twenty hours of community service each week, as approved and directed by the probation officer, to begin within the first ninety days of placement on supervision.
17. The defendant shall register with local law enforcement agencies and the state attorney general, as directed by the probation officer.
23. If the defendant is not delivered to a duly authorized immigration official for deportation proceedings, within 72 hours of placement on supervision, the defendant shall report in person to the nearest supervision unit of the U.S. Probation Office for this district between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., and thereafter, as directed by the probation officer.

FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS

It is further ordered that the defendant shall pay to the government a total special assessment of \$1,100.00, which shall be due and payable immediately to the clerk of this court.

The court finds that the defendant does not have the funds or financial resources to pay a fine required under § 5E1.2 (c) of the guidelines manual without impairing his ability to support himself; therefore, the court is imposing no fine.
